

Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II

Recently we gathered together to give thanks for the life of the only Queen that most of us have ever known, our memories will inevitably be drawn to others we have also known, and are no longer with us. Bereavement and grief can be unpredictable. Feelings that we think have been left behind can suddenly unsettle us.

Two years ago, the children and young people in our schools were hit by an unprecedented global pandemic. The enforced lockdowns and Covid precautions meant that for many, endings were unsaid and life events missed.

For some children, the extensive coverage of the Queen's departure and the public displays of grief and flowers might raise feelings that they cannot name and questions you might not feel confident to answer. Adults also sometimes struggle to help children through this difficult period, however, for the children it is important that we try to do so and support them in the best way possible.

The attached leaflet is a colourful, child friendly way to talk to children about the life that the Queen spent as a monarch but also as a public servant.

Back to School and Online Safety

As the children return to school and are now settling into their new classes there will be important things they may have forgotten about general online safety rules. Please continue to remind your children about reporting anything of concern to a trusted adult – this can be a parent/carer, teacher or another adult they know well and can trust.

Children are now spending more and more time online playing games but also for completing homework and reading. Any login details and passwords should not be shared with anyone and if children report that someone is asking for this information or details about their home address and telephone numbers. Sharing of photos online or via WhatsApp is also a growing concern with children being enticed by peers or adults to send nude or semi-nude pictures.

The school and staff continue to work with the children to inform and educate them about staying safe both online and offline. Staying safe and respecting others is taught through lessons and form part of our weekly assemblies.
