<u>HEADLINES OF THE MAIN ACHIEVEMENTS</u> <u>YEAR 2020-21</u>

- St Edward's offered an engaging, dynamic remote learning with the breadth and depth of the curriculum being explored.
- The school's technology has improved and developed drastically in one year. This includes a full wireless infrastructure, new school website, the implementation of chrome books in classes, use of Microsoft and Google as learning platforms and providing all vulnerable pupils with a home learning device, which has enhanced children's learning.
- Despite covid restrictions, school celebrations and events have still continued such as prom, graduation, sports day, the Father Dennis Cup and Thorpe park
- All Governing Body meetings have taken place this academic year and the school is working closely with the Multi Academy Trust
- All pupils have been assessed and monitoring of attainment and progress has enabled gaps in learning to be identified and interventions put in place.
- Pupil voice has been strengthened this academic year through the implementation of subject ambassador teams as well as existing teams of the school council, house captains and the teaching and learning committee.
- Mental health and well-being were a school priority. Children were part of Mental Health week, NSPCC workshops and the new implementation of the Rising Stars well-being surveys enable quick identification of pupils who need further support in these areas.



<u>COVID Update</u> <u>September 2021</u>

The school year has started well and children are getting back into a more normal school routine. As always, our children have been fantastic and have adapted to the continuous changes very well. Following government advice we will be operating as follows:

The school gates in the playground will open at 8.45 am - children can start coming into school at that time and will go straight to their classes.
All children should be in school by 8.55 am. The school gates will be locked by the latest at 9.00 am.

• We ask that parents/carers drop their children off and leave the school gates clear.

• If children are late, they will have to go to the front gate in Green Street with their parents/carers and inform the office staff who will ensure that children come into school and go to their classes.

- · Children in EYFS and KS1 can be collected at 3.10 pm
- · Children in Years 3, 4,5 and 6 can be collected at 3.15 pm

 \cdot We will continue to ensure that hand washing/sanitising takes place frequently throughout the day and surfaces are cleaned regularly

- · The school will be well ventilated throughout the day
- · Parent meetings will remain virtual
- · Visitors will be kept to only those who are essential

· A copy of our updated risk assessment is on our school website

Please note the following procedures should anyone in your family have symptoms of COVID or test positive for it.

• If your child has symptoms please keep them at home for the required period of 10 days and get them tested.

• If a lateral flow test shows a positive result then follow this up with a PCR test within 2 days of the lateral flow test. If the PCR test result is positive then your child will continue to isolate. If the PCR test is negative then your child can return to school. We will need to see evidence of a test result before allowing the child back to school.

If a positive case is received and the school are informed then only the child who is positive will isolate - the rest of their class or year group will not need to isolate.
If someone in your family other than your child tests positive for COVID then your child does not need to isolate and can continue coming to school as long as they do not have symptoms.

· Please continue to monitor your children regularly.

• If your child develops symptoms whilst at school then they will be put into isolation and wait there until the parent/carer arrives to collect them.

• If you wish for your child to be tested at school then we will need your permission to do this with a lateral flow test as this gives an instant result.

What is It's Good to Grow?




SHARING SUNDAY'S GOSPEL




Our Special Time Together


