



"The family is the first and foremost teacher of peace." Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI


Word is

Jesus never wants us to be worried or upset - he gives us the gift of God's peace. Ask your child what the word 'peace' means to them. Ask them when they feel most at peace, or when they feel most safe and not worried about anything. Do they know someone who is a good peacemaker - someone who always helps to ease trouble because they bring God's love with them? St Teresa of Calcutta reminds us: *Peace begins with a smile.*
