They also explored the lives of non-white saints in commemoration of All Saint's Day. In tribute to universal child day on 20th November, they taught us about child heroes who have helped to make the world a brighter and better place for all children.



Our Year 5 went on a trip to watch the musical, The Prince of Egypt, which retells the story of Moses and the first Passover as part of their curriculum studying Judaism. The pupils, staff and parents who attended the performance were dazzled by the props and stage scenery. What a great pleasure to receive such amazing feedback. Thank you to all our Year 5's, you have done the school proud!











Advent is an opportunity to be spiritually refreshed and helps us get ready for Christmas.


